19th Instalment of PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi live streamed at Car Nicobar

Car Nicobar, Feb. 25

ICAR KVK Nicobar, in collaboration with the District Agriculture Department, organized a program for the live viewing of the 19th instalment release of the PM-KISAN scheme and the 'KISAN Samman Samaroh' in the community hall at Perka Village, Car Nicobar. More than 80 farmers gathered at the venue to participate in this significant event, aimed at providing financial support and



disseminating information about various Government agricultural schemes. The chief guest of the program, Shri Amit Kale, IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Nicobar, officially inaugurated the event.
